Let's Talk About Pastor Ballentine's Retirement

I give great thanks for Pastor Ballentine's partnership and ministry! It is indeed right (and probably salutary) that St. Stephen celebrate his 40 years of ordained ministry. We will have a celebration in-between services on July 7. Per his request, it will be low-key. Pastor Ballentine said he does not want us to laud him with praise that day. Save those words for his retirement festivities. (We can say nice things about him anyway. When given a choice, take both.) Bishop Humphrey will be here that day and will preach.

Celebrations for Pastor Ballentine's ministry and retirement are in the planning stages for July 13 and 14. Information is outlined on page five.

I give thanks for you, and for your partnership in sharing and living the Gospel. Together, we will navigate through the emotional and logistical consequences of Pastor Ballentine's retirement. Ending 18 years of healthy and strong ministry partnership means that we will experience grief, and that is normal. Transitions produce anxiety, and that is normal.

Together, we can minimize the uneasiness that comes with change. There are two ways to accomplish this. First, manage your own anxiety. Breathe. Acknowledge your emotions, and then tap into your thinking brain. Second, let's have open and honest conversations. Ask Pastor Ballentine and me questions. If someone asks you a question and you do not know the answer, it is okay to say, "I don't know." Suggest that s/he speak with one of the pastors. Our doors are open. Secrets and misinformation are not helpful to anyone.

Bishop. Bishop Humphrey and his assistants Pastor Kelly Bayer-Derrick and Pastor John Wertz have been in conversation with Pastor Ballentine and me. As part of the Synod's normal engagement with congregations whose pastor is leaving, Bishop Humphrey or Pastor Bayer-Derrick will meet with our Congregation Council in June. Together, we will reflect upon and verbalize our appreciation of Pastor Ballentine's ministry among us. Pastor Ballentine will then leave our meeting, and we will begin our conversations about the process that lies ahead, concerns we have, and what is important to us as church.

If you would like to know in more detail what's involved in this transition, go to the Virginia Synod website, vasynod.org, and to the tab at the top for "Resources," and then to the "Call Process." Here is a general outline of what is to come:

- The Synod's intent is that an interim pastor will begin in early August. This pastor will assist me.
- On Saturday, September 14, Pastor John Wertz will lead our congregation through a workshop that will assess where we are in our ministries, and what our vision is for our next few years.
- The information gleaned from this workshop will help us to complete our Church Profile. The Council will appoint a committee to complete our profile. (Related documents are available through the above link that I shared.)
- We will also appoint a call committee. (Related documents are available through the above link as well.)
- The process from its start until we call a pastor will take 18 months or more.

Along with the LSA committee, I will now care for our Lutheran Student Association ministry, and provide pastoral leadership for our Preschool. Leadership for other ministries will be determined. Pastor Ballentine and I will work together through some of these decisions.

You all are a blessing! Thank you for your offers of assistance during this transition. One of the best ways to help each other is to keep our conversations open and honest.

Pastoral Transition Q/A

Here are the latest questions that have been asked:

- Q: The process between your leaving and a new pastor arriving is estimated to take 18 months. Why so long?
- A: Because there are three significant parts to the process:
 - First, the congregation has to work through the emotions involved when I am actually gone. (Do you know how, when you lose a loved one, you're advised not to make any major decisions for at least a year? The same is true in this case!)
 - 2. During these months, a committee will need to be appointed to work with the Bishop's office through an elaborate self-study process: What are the needs of the congregation and the opportunities God is presenting? What might staffing look like to lead in meeting those needs and pursuing those opportunities?
 - 3. If the decision is made to call another pastor, a call committee will then be appointed to work with the Bishop's office in receiving dossiers from pastors the Bishop recommends for consideration, interviewing candidates, asking for more names if necessary and, finally, recommending a primary candidate to the Council and congregation.

- Q: Will we have two pastors who are equal, as we do now? Or will there be a Senior Pastor and Associate?
- A: That is for Pastor Griffin and the congregation to discern during the self-study process.
- Q: Will we have a chance to celebrate and wish you well?
- A: Yes! We're looking forward to Sunday, July 7, the actual 40th anniversary of my ordination. Virginia Synod Robert Humphrey will be with us that morning during our worship services! And, look for events the next weekend, July 13-14, when we'll be able to celebrate and give thanks for our 18 years together as pastor and congregation.
- Q: When will your last Sunday be?
- A: My last Sunday will be July 21. Patty and I will spend the next week with our children and grandchildren during our annual week at Pawleys Island, SC.

STEPHEN MINISTRY AT ST. STEPHEN



25 YEARS OF STEPHEN MINISTRY

2019 marks the 25th anniversary of Stephen Ministry at St. Stephen, a true milestone for our congregation. Stephen Ministers are lay people who provide highly confidential one-on-one Christian counseling for individuals undergoing life crisies or personal challenges, often over a period of months or years. They undergo fifty hours of training and have twice-monthly supervision and continuing education sessions going forward while they are active Stephen Ministers. They extend and supplement the work of our pastors, parish nurse and the other ministries of our church.

We are particularly fortunate this June to be commissioning three new Stephen Ministers in our congregation:

Kathy Skube joined St. Stephen in 2017 after moving to Williamsburg to be close to her son, daughter-in-law and grandchildren. She grew up in the Detroit area but lived most of her adult life in California where she was a teacher and then a school principal in San Diego. She also volunteers in Literacy for Life and is a Master Gardener. She has been in the Faith Formation Ministry with our church.

Pete Davis joined St. Stephen in 2018 after moving east. He lived most of his life in California and Arizona. In his early career, he performed medical laboratory work, but most of his career, he worked as a Certified Public Accountant. He did extensive volunteer work in the Phoenix area before he and his wife Julie moved to Williamsburg. He is the treasurer of his homeowners' association.

Alison Carney joined St. Stephen in 2018. She and her husband previously lived in Northern Virginia where she worked in marketing for architectural, engineering and construction firms. She volunteers with Dream Catchers at the Cori Sikich Therapeutic Riding Center. She is active with the Peninsula Women's Network and is on the board of her homeowner's association. She is an avid kayaker.

The addition of these three highly qualified and gifted individuals to the Stephen Ministry team is a true blessing. We hope that you will welcome them warmly into their new ministry.

HEART HEALTHY EATING

Summer is coming. There are so many fruits and vegetables available now. You can find them at the grocery store, the farmer's market and even little roadside stands. A THOUGHT FOR MEMORIAL DAY



This is a time when we think of others now gone who had some significant impact on our lives. But it useful to realize that each of us, in contemplating our own eventual

demise, have the capability of making a gift to others of incredible impact in changing lives - irrespective of our individual financial circumstances.

Through making a decision now to be an organ donor, flagged on your driver's license, your body at the time of death can help multiple people on waiting lists to receive a body part replacement. Finding suitable matches nationally is coordinated in Richmond at the large UNOS 24/7 match center downtown. Because medical science can now do so much more, **U**nited **N**etwork for **O**rgan **S**haring can

utilize such components as corneas, bone, skin, tendons and veins as well as organs such as kidneys, intestines and hearts (and heart valves). Please pick up some of the explanatory material in the Gathering Space for information on how to participate in this lifeenhancing program.

An alternative use for your body after death is a whole body donation through the Virginia Department of Health. From its HQ a block away from UNOS, the **Anatomical Gift Program** allocates cadavers among Virginia's 4 medical schools and 3 schools of physical therapy. The ability for students to work with three-dimensional bodies rather than videos improves their understanding of the inter-relatedness of the parts they will be dealing with in their medical careers.

Both of these programs are totally without cost to the donor's family. If desired, the donor's ashes can be returned to the family for interment. UNOS is a publicly-supported 501(C)3 charity and tax-deductible monetary gifts are welcomed.
