Call to Worship

Greetings to the joyful, the content, the hopeful, and the cheerful. **Bring your** laughter, your celebrations, and your delight to worship.

Welcome to the mournful, the anxious, the overwhelmed, and the afraid.

Bring your thoughts, your worries, your concerns, and your fears to worship. We all come from different places, with different experiences, and with different expectations. **God alone knows our inner thoughts and looks upon us with compassion.**

Come as you are. Come with all your feelings. God will help us process and transform our feelings into faithful action.

Come as you are. Come with all your feelings. **Come, let us worship together in unity.**

Palm Sunday Confession

Let us confess the ways in which we have treated ourselves with judgment and cruelty. Compassionate God, you love us and treat us tenderly, even when we are struggling to do what is right. In spite of your patience with us, we condemn ourselves, judge ourselves, and tell ourselves lies. We declare that we love our neighbors and then we turn our backs on the homeless and hungry in our communities.

We confess we treat ourselves harshly, condemn our own mistakes, and punish ourselves when we fail. We confess we call ourselves names, can be our own worst bullies, and look in the mirror without love for our faces. We confess we give up on ourselves, treat ourselves with unkindness, and withhold good things from our lives. We confess we choose the well-being of others over ourselves when we really need to rest and recover. We confess we believe negative things others say about us and deny words spoken which bless us. We confess we confuse confidence for arrogance and self-love for indulgence.

For you, God, adore us. You are kind to us, forgiving us when we fail. Show each of us how we might love ourselves, not from a place of self-absorption or narcissism, but in the knowledge that you made us, and we belong to you. **Amen.**

Let love and forgiveness banish all shame, for we are made whole in Christ when we confess our shortcomings. Be free to love yourself and all the traits God gave you. **Amen.**

Gospel

Jesus enters Jerusalem. Response after announcement of the Gospel: "Glory to you, O Lord."

¹When they were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, [Jesus] sent two of his disciples ²and said to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; untie it and bring it. ³If anyone says to you, 'Why are you doing this?' just say this, 'The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately." ⁴They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, ⁵some of the bystanders said to them, "What are you doing, untying the colt?" ⁶They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. ⁷Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. ⁸Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. ⁹Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! ¹⁰Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!"¹¹Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.



Eco-Palms – Social and Environmental Justice

Why Eco-Palms?

- •Eco-Palms preserve the vitality of the communities and forests for years to come.
- •Community groups receive five to six times the normal payment per frond.
- •Eco-Palms are purchased directly from the communities, which lessens the impact of the fluctuating market and allows value-added processing to take place within the community.
- •A typical Eco-Palm is harvested in the forest by men and processed by the women of the community. This increases employment opportunities for women in the community and helps them contribute to their family's financial stability.
- •Continue to buy palms for Easter without a market for the palms, the forests are at risk of being converted to agricultural fields.
