Acts 2:1-21

Let's Talk Sunshine

And while we are here, let's talk sunscreen. Sunscreen filters UV rays before they reach your skin. There are two types:

- 1) Mineral sunscreens containing titanium dioxide and zinc oxide or
- 2) Chemical filters containing avobenzone, heomosalate, octocrylene, octinoxate, otisálate, or oxygen zone.

Mineral sunscreens work by reflecting or scattering UV rays before they penetrate the skin. Chemical sunscreens are partially absorbed into the skin and create a chemical reaction that helps prevent UV damage. Dermatologists will typically recommend the mineral sunscreens with titanium dioxide and zinc oxide as the safest and most effective way to protect your skin.

There are two types of rays: UVA and UVB. Broad spectrum sunscreens protect against UVA The SPF numbers tell you how much protection you get against UVB rays. Do not be skimpy when applying sunscreen. For adults, one ounce (the amount in a shot glass) is needed to protect their face, neck, arms and legs. Apply often and early to make sure your protection is maintained. Use an SPF of at least 30 as a good starting point and be sure to check the expiration date.
