NAMES

There are a lot of names for God found in Holy Scripture. Over two dozen different names are used in the book of Genesis alone. So I thought we might explore some of them.

The most common name used for God in Genesis is Elohim (אֱלֹהִים), which comes from the root El (אֱלֹהִים), which simply means "God." What is striking about Elohim is that it is plural in Hebrew; almost conveying the sense that the divine cannot be contained in a single entity. Various other names based on the root El are used throughout the Hebrew Bible, including El Elyon (אֵל שֵׁלְיוֹן) "God Most High," El Shaddai (אֵל שִׁלַּבוֹ) "Almighty or All-Sufficient God," El Olam (אֵל עוֹבֶם) "Everlasting God," and many others.

The second name variation I want to draw your attention to is the name God reveals to Moses from the burning bush, Yahweh (sometimes Jehovah) which is known as the tetragrammaton. This name is made up of four consonants and appears in Hebrew as יהוּה. The root of this name comes from the Hebrew verb חַיָּה which has to do with existence. Orthodox Jews will neither write nor speak this version of God's name, believing that to do so would profane it. In those communities you will find the tetragrammaton often being substituted with the Greek Adonai (which means Lord) or G-d.

The last name I want to draw your attention to is my favorite name for God in the Hebrew Bible. I could have included it in the list of *El* names, as it uses the that form,

but I pulled it out from that list for one very specific reason. This name is the first name Scripture tells us is given to God by a human. The name is *El Roi* (אֵל רֵאֶי) and it comes out of Genesis 16.

As a quick reminder, Genesis 16 tells the story of Sarai becoming jealous of Hagar and her son, Ishmael. This is after Sarai encourages Abram to have a child with Hagar, which makes it particularly galling! Sarai complains to Abram and he tells her to do as she pleases. Well, what pleased Sarai was to deal "harshly with" Hagar, causing her to run away with her infant. God then sends an angel to Hagar and promises to bless her with a multitude of offspring if she returns to Abram and Sarai. Hagar responds to this blessing by naming God *El Roi* which means "God who sees."

What a beautiful name! Now, the text tells us that Hagar gives God this name while wondering "Have I really seen God and remained alive after seeing him?" But even more than that, what a beautiful name for God from someone who likely feels lost, abandoned, alone, and unseen! Hagar is in a terrible situation, she has every reason for despair. And yet, God sees her. God sees the hopelessness of her plight, and God intervenes. What a powerful thought. No matter how desperate the straights, or how terrible the trials, God sees you. And the promise of Christ is that not only does God see you, but God is with you too! Another powerful name for God, Immanuel, God-with-us!

The August Council meeting was held on August 13, 2024.

- Rev. John Wertz, ELCA Director for Evangelical Mission/Assistant to the Bishop, was welcomed with appreciation for his knowledge, experience, and counsel.
- New Council members were welcomed: Bill Dichtel, Beth Grant, and Terri Larsen.
- In support of the HVAC campaign, \$238,000 has been raised toward the \$300,000 goal. Total to date includes both money received and pledged.
- Estimates for automatic front door openers are being reviewed.
- Reconciling in Christ (RIC) committee is working on a selection of one-on-one meetings to gather input.
- New members will be welcomed at worship on Sunday, October 5.
- The slate of officers was approved: J.R. Lyons, president; Julie Meeks, vice president; Alison Carney, secretary; Brian Agor, treasurer; and Karen Nester, financial secretary.
- Washer/dryer units are planned for addition to the college room. Funding is still needed to cover balance of \$3,000.
- Rev. John Wertz and Council discussed at length next steps for St. Stephen's ministry plan. Council is in discernment, looking at current and coming needs. Information will be shared as it becomes available.
- Loneliness is a serious problem for the aging, and for many, many others. We are reminded to make a point to reach out, connect, make a difference; we are called to be the hands and feet of Christ for one another.

The next Council meeting is scheduled for September 10.


HVAC PROJECT PLEDGE DRIVE UPDATE

The Loneliness Epidemic

Pastor Jon spoke about loneliness in his sermon on August 11. The Surgeon General wrote a book about loneliness. Loneliness is defined by Merriman-Webster as being without company, cut off from others, and not frequented by human beings. It truly is an epidemic. Single people can be lonely. Married people can be lonely. You can be lonely in a crowd of people. Loneliness often goes hand in hand with depression. Lonely people are not likely to reach out for help. They are not likely say, "please come visit me."

At the beginning of the pandemic, our church asked the Stephen Ministers to divide the directory and reach out to everyone to see how they were doing. We were to ask if they lived alone or if they had people around them. We were to call them at least monthly to see how they continued to manage the pandemic and quarantine. As the pandemic ended and we began to come back to church, we tried to continue the practice. Now we are four years after the beginning of the pandemic. Most of us have returned to our normal. But there are so many who have not been able to return to any normal. They may have chronic illness and cannot move about in public freely. They may not drive and may have no way of getting out of the house to join others.

There are so many other reasons a person may need to talk to someone. Are they going through problems with a relationship, or have they lost someone recently? Do they live alone?

While we are not licensed counselors, we are Stephen Ministers. We can help. We talk to people in confidence. But, we need your help. If you or someone you know is struggling with loneliness, please reach out to our **Stephen Leader Bill Dichtel** or **Pastor Jon**. If you or someone you know is going through a difficult time, please let us know. We are here to help.


